## Homophones and near Homophones

Some words sound the same or very similar, but they are spelt differently and have different meanings.

These words are called homophones or near homophones.

homophone: pray and prey
to and two

near homophone: quiet and quite

### **Common Exception Words**

We have been learning to spell the common exception words **journey** and **area**.

#### Grammar

When direct speech does not end with a full stop, a question mark or an exclamation mark, we use a comma **inside** the speech marks, e.g.

"That cake looks delicious," said the boy.


